# Hackney Teaching & Schools' Alliance EARLY CAREER TEACHERS









Our Early Career Teachers have had an insightful and successful year at their respective schools, where they have continued to utilise the extensive training from within their schools and the sessions provided with their pupils.

This term, the HTSA have worked in partnership with the East London Teaching School Hub to deliver the Early Career Framework. Our ECTs have also attended additional enhancement sessions at Nightingale Primary School and Kingsmead Primary School, where the HTSA have worked with our Specialist Leaders of Education to share high quality teaching practice, with topics including Quality First Teaching, Emotional Intelligence, Creative Arts, Computing, Geography, Art and PE, being the focus of some of the training. The first half of the term was spent sitting down, learning about and discussing best practice with the specialist leaders and peers, whilst the second half of the term allowed ECTs to get practical and creative in Art, PE and Geography.

We are excited to welcome the group back in September for their second ECT year.

We'd like to wish them all the best with their teaching careers!


















#### MIDDLE LEADERSHIP PROGRAMME

We are so proud of this year's cohort and are excited to see where their careers will take them!








## SUMMER CELEBRATION


