### Hackney Teaching & Schools' Alliance SUCCESSFUL CLASSROOM PRACTICE

Our second Successful Classroom Practice session took place this half term at Kingsmead Primary School, where participants were able to consider evidence-based teaching strategies and reflect on teaching practices that work for them and their classes.

Kate Roberts, HTSA Director, led the session, where our teachers considered what they could do to ensure their pupils are engaged and actively participating in lessons across the curriculum. They also brought a recording of a lesson to watch and evaluate with a peer colleague, with a focus on an approach known to make an impact on learning learning, based on the educational research Kate covered in the first session.

The last session of the course will be led by Mark Burns, author of "Teaching Backwards", and is open to teachers from both primary and secondary schools, so get in touch if you would like a member of your team to join this as a standalone session, and we can make arrangements for them to join on 14th June 2022.
